7. The P6 students will celebrate the completion of their six years of education in QtPS with the P6 Graduation Party on Thursday, 7 November. The party will start at 7.45 am and will be held in the school hall. Please note that the dismissal time for the P6 students will be as

usual, at 1.30 pm. There will be a late morning brunch for the students, coupled with fun games and activities to celebrate the occasion. They will come to school in their school uniforms and should bring along a set of smart casual attire to change into for the party. Please note that more details will be disseminated to your child/ward via the Form Teachers.

Education and Careers Guidance Week (4-8 November)

- 8. The Education and Careers Guidance (ECG) Week 2024, themed "Soaring Beyond Limits, Reaching New Heights," will take place from 4-8 November. The event aims to equip students with the knowledge and inspiration they need to explore diverse career paths and to understand the values and philosophies of various professions.
- 9. Throughout the week, students will be exposed to engaging activities designed to broaden their perspectives. Morning assembly talks, scheduled for 4 and 5 November will feature professionals from different industries. They will be providing insights into their work and share about the skills necessary for future careers. The week will conclude with an exhibition on 8 November, where organisations will set up booths to interact directly with students, offering them the opportunity to learn about different careers and the skills required for success in those fields. The Primary 2s will also have a separate classroom sharing by parent volunteers.
- 10. Through this event, the school aims to inspire students to soar beyond limits and prepare them for the ever-evolving workforce.

- 11. Prize-Giving Day 2024 aims to motivate, celebrate and acknowledge our Queenstowners' achievements. Last Day of School for 2024 and First Day of School Arrangements for 2025

- 18. The last day of school for P1 and P2 students will be 13 November 2024, unless they are receiving awards on Prize Giving Day, 14 November 2024. The last day of school for P3 to P6 students will be 14 November 2024.
- 19. P1 (2025) students will report on the first day of school on Thursday, 2 Jan 2025, while the P2 to P6 (2025) students will report to school on Friday, 3 Jan 2025.

Change of Vehicular Drop-off during Morning Arrivals

- 20. The HDB open carpark adjacent to the school will be closed permanently effective 4th November 2024. As such, we will be allowing vehicular drop-off inside the school from 6.30am onwards, starting 4th November 2024.
- 21. Due to the expected heavy traffic, you are strongly advised to cater an additional 10 minutes for your travelling. If you wish to avoid the congestion, you may consider using the alternate drop-off points outside school at SkyOasis @Dawson Blk 42A or Skyville @Dawson Blk 88A, and your child/children can walk to school via the bus-stop gate and back gate respectively. Please ensure your children are ready to alight when you arrive at the school foyer to ease potential congestion. There will be no right turn when exiting the school gate from 6.45am-7.45am as mandated by the LTA. For more information, please refer to the memo sent out via PG dated 14 October 2024.
- 22. For vehicular pick-ups after dismissal, the school main gate will be opened about 20 mins after school dismissal timing. Please note that there is strictly <u>No Waiting</u> within the school compound.
